| | 29-3.1 | Fee Structure for existing students and students to be admitted in various UG, PG, Integrated Programmes and Ph.D. Programmes for Academic year 2024-25. <p>A committee was constituted vide Office Order CURAJ/R/F.156/2024/4511 dated 15/03/2024 to review the fee structure to be implemented for the academic year 2024-25 for UG, PG and Ph.D. programmes of the University for newly admitted students in 2024-25 and existing students of the University.</p> <p>As per the directives received from Ministry of Education, erstwhile Ministry of Human Resources and Development, the University in its 10th Meeting held on 25.10.2013 Academic Council considered the proposal of the revision of fees and recommended for fee revision at the rate of 10% in all components of fee structure every year. The 10% increase was done 2014-15 to 2023-24 each year.</p> <p>The committee was also given the responsibility to review the fee structure for students to be admitted in 2024-25.</p> <p>The details of the Committee recommendation (attached as Annexure-B) including fee structure applicable for existing students and for student admitted in 2024-25 is as under:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> The committee recommended that this yearly 10% increase may not be done for the existing students. The fee structure applicable for the academic year 2023-24 (except the one-time fee charged in 1st semester) will continue for the rest of the duration for all the existing students. There will be no 10% annual increments in the fee for the existing students. The committee has gone through the fee structure for the academic year 2023-24 and suggested readjusting the fee structure to be implemented for the students to be admitted in 2024-25. Categories of the programme have been re-structured. The committee also recommended that there will be no change in the fee structure of new admission to Ph.D. programmes including an increase of fees of 10%. Further, the committee members have gone through the Electricity Bills of last 3 semesters and no. of students i.e. Jan-July 2023, July-December 2023 and Jan-May 2024. The committee recommended charging additional amount of Rs.2,000/- (Round off) for electricity and Rs. 500/- for water, per student per semester for the academic year 2024-25. <p>Resolution: The Academic Council noted and ratified the action taken by the University towards implementation of the fee structure of the existing students and students to be admitted for Academic year 2024-25. The members appreciated that the University has not increased the fee of the existing students and not changed the fee structure of new admission in Ph.D programmes.</p> | | |

| 29-3.6 | <p>Discontinuation of M.A. Cultural Informatics programme under Department of Society Technology Interface from the Academic year 2024-25</p> <p>A request was received from Head-Department of Society Technology Interface to discontinue of M.A. Cultural Informatics programme. The programme was initially started in 2017-18 as a PG Diploma in Cultural informatics and later in 2018-19 the programme was converted to M.A. Cultural Informatics.</p> <p>The programme had faced challenges in attracting applications since the starting of this programme, despite efforts to promote the programme but couldn't able to get admissions in this programme.</p> <p>The matter was placed before the Board of Studies, School Meeting and Competent Authority and the same was approved.</p> <p>Resolution: The Academic Council noted and ratified the same.</p> |
| 29-3.7 | <p>Recognition of Dr. Bhupendra Goswami, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry and Dr. Sudhir Bhaskar, Assistant Professor, Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering as Research Supervisor</p> <p>Two applications were received from Dr. Bhupendra Goswami, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry and Dr. Sudhir Bhaskar, Assistant Professor, Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering for recognizing as Research Supervisor.</p> <p>As per Ordinance 09 of the University, an Assistant Professor can become a Research Supervisor if (a) He has a Ph.D Degree and (b) Has publication in referred Journals and (c) has put in at least two years of teaching/ research experience after obtaining Ph.D degree.</p> <p>They both have fulfilled the minimum eligibility of being a Research Supervisor as per Ordinance 09 of the University. The competent Authority has approved both of them as a Research Supervisor.</p> <p>Resolution: The Academic Council noted and ratified the same.</p> |

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| 29-4.31 | <p>Proposal for Engagement of International Faculty at the Central University of Rajasthan</p> <p>To strengthen international academic collaborations and to enrich the teaching and research ecosystem, it is proposed to engage International Guest Faculty from reputed foreign institutions. This initiative aligns with the University's vision to promote global academic excellence.</p> <p>It is proposed to invite distinguished faculty members from reputed international institutions for short-term teaching and research engagements at the Central University of Rajasthan. The draft guidelines proposed for such appointments are as under:</p> <p><u>Guidelines for employing foreign faculty for a short duration</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. International guest faculty should be from a reputed foreign institute. 2. Faculty must have long standing research and or teaching experience in reputed foreign institute. 3. Purpose: Enhancing academic and research collaboration with Central University of Rajasthan 4. Remuneration: Remuneration may be at the level of Professor in Indian Central University. (Consolidated amount: Rs. 1.5 -2.0 lakhs/Month) 5. Duration: One semester or at least three months. 6. Responsibility of the guest faculty: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i) Teaching of graduate and post graduate courses ii) Delivering lectures and special training iii) Research activity in the Department/School iv) Preparation of manuscript/grant proposals. 7. Duration of responsibility 40 hrs/ week 8. Accommodation preferably in guest house of Central University of Rajasthan 9. Food and logistics: Rs 3000-5000/- per day for food and logistics support. 10. Travel: Arrangement of International and domestic travel (To and Fro) may be arranged by Central University of Rajasthan if required. 11. University authority will provide Invitation letter to Foreign Faculty 12. University authority will provide support letter for VISA processing if required. 13. Faculty must have health insurance to cover the medical expenses if required. 14. Faculty must provide medical fitness certificate. 15. 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| | <p><i>End of Semester Examination only for such courses within one month of beginning of the new semester. For Integrated Studies, this clause is applicable only if the student opts for Exit option or in the final year. The grade for this course in Special End of Semester Examination cannot be more than Letter Grade B.</i> As per standard academic procedures, back paper examinations are generally conducted along with the regular examinations of the respective semesters — i.e., odd semester back papers during odd semester exams and even semester back papers during even semester exams.</p> <p>In the interest of students and to provide them with more opportunities to clear their backlog papers without waiting for the next corresponding semester It is proposed that backlog examinations of each semester will be conducted before the regular examinations i.e. conducting back paper examinations of both semesters (odd and even) in each End Semester Examination, irrespective of whether the current semester is odd or even. This will offer students greater flexibility and faster academic progression. This approach maximizes the chances for students to clear their backlog papers and reduces the academic delay caused by waiting for the respective semester's exam cycle.
