The institute of Development studies Jaipur was granted recognition by the University for the Ph.D. Program in Economics the same was approved during the academic council meeting held on  $08^{th}$  July 2013 as Item no. 9-4.4.

Mr. Prem Kumar submitted his Ph.D thesis on 19.06.2023. Prof. Mohan Kumar S. has moved from IDS Jaipur to Kerala and now working as a visiting Professor at IDS Jaipur. #### 29-4.29 Proposal for CURAJ Research Internship Policy

The Central University of Rajasthan (CURAJ) acknowledges the growing importance of research in the nation-building process and is keen on developing skilled human resources for this purpose. In light of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the university is taking steps to initiate a structured CURAJ Research Internship Policy, aimed at nurturing research aptitude among undergraduate and postgraduate students.

This Research Internship Program is expected to bring several benefits to the University, including:

- a) Increased national visibility of CURAJ
- b) Attraction of motivated, research-oriented candidates.
- c) Early engagement with potential future students for higher studies i.e PhD at CURaj.
- d) Availability of additional young workforce for research groups.
- e) Revenue generation for faculty and CURAJ.

To initiate this process, it is proposed to form a committee responsible for drafting the "CURAJ Research Internship Policy" and preparing a detailed agenda for its implementation across departments.

A committee may be constituted, comprising the Director (R&D), Finance Officer, Chief Warden (Hostel), and two experts (one from a science, & one from a non-science discipline).

Suggested responsibilities of the committee will be, i) Draft a comprehensive CURAJ internship policy, ii) Define the eligibility, structure, internship fee, and selection procedures and iii) Propose mechanisms for supervision, assessment, and feedback.

Resolution: The Academic Council approved the above proposal for having CURAJ Research Internship Policy and constitute a Committee as proposed above. Further, authorized the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor approve its recommendations and implement the same on its behalf.

#### 29-4.30 Commencement of New Programmes in School of Architecture.

#### A. Starting of the M. Plan program in the School of Architecture

The matter regarding the commencement of the M. Plan. The School Board has been recommending to commence a program in the meetings held on 12th October 2022 and 06 March 2023, and was placed in the 26th Academic Council in its meeting held on 26.11.2023, and the Academic Council asked the School Board to reconsider starting in a self-finance mode. In the next two consecutive school Board meetings, held on 06.03.2024, and May 2025, the School board approved the M. Plan program to be started as a regular program and denied its possibility to run in a self-financed mode.

Looking at the low admissions in M.Arch (Sustainable Architecture) over the last three years, the School Board Members have agreed to discontinue the M.Arch program and start the two-year Master's in Planning program. It was noted that there are substantial job opportunities for Planners in the government sector as well as the private sector.

To start the program, the AICTE model syllabus may be adopted with minor changes as suited for the University's programme. Additions/changes may be incorporated in due course of time. The School Board also approved the seat matrix and eligibility of the candidates. Seat Intake of the program

The School Board suggested that in addition to the 15 seats , 3 more seats may be added for sponsored candidates.

Eligibility for the program:

Bachelor's Degree in Planning, Architecture, Civil Engineering, or Architectural Engineering with 55 percent marks or M.A. Geography, M.Sc. Environmental Science, MA /MSC Economics, with 60 percent marks from a recognized university or equivalent.

#### B. To start the B. Des. (Interior Design) program

A four-year graduation program which will have multiple exit options in line with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. Students may exit after one year, two years with a Diploma in Interior Design, or after three years with a B. Voc. Students who complete all four years will be awarded the B. Des. degree. Additionally, Students passing out of CURAJ can continue with one additional year and will be awarded a B.Des degree or B.VOC Hons or B.VOC (Research) as mentioned in the National Credit Framework. School Board members approved the structure of the New B.Des. (Interior Design) program, which is inclusive of the B.Voc program. It was resolved to continue the B.Voc programme for the current year. In the next Academic Year, admission could be offered to the B. Des Programme with an exit option with a B.Voc (Interior Design) degree.

	17.1 If a student of the final semester gets 'F' grade in not more than total of 2 courses in the final two semesters of his/her Programme of Study and has no backlog in earlier semesters, the University may make arrangement to hold Special

	End of Semester Examination only for such courses within one month of beginning of the new semester. For Integrated Studies, this clause is applicable only if the student opts for Exit option or in the final year. The grade for this course in Special End of Semester Examination cannot be more than Letter Grade B.As per standard academic procedures, back paper examinations are generally conducted along with the regular examinations of the respective semesters — i.e., odd semester back papers during odd semester exams and even semester back papers during even semester exams.
	In the interest of students and to provide them with more opportunities to clear their backlog papers without waiting for the next corresponding semester. It is proposed that backlog examinations of each semester will be conducted before the regular examinations i.e. conducting back paper examinations of both semesters (odd and even) in each End Semester Examination, irrespective of whether the current semester is odd or even. This will offer students greater flexibility and faster academic progression. This approach maximizes the chances for students to clear their backlog papers and reduces the academic delay caused by waiting for the respective semester's exam cycle. It also supports the timely completion of the degree for final-year students.  Further Such special examination as mentioned in the clause no. 17.1, will be conducted only for students failed in the final semester courses of the programmes instead of <i>final two semesters</i> i.e. If a student of the final semester gets 'F' grade in not more than total of 2 courses in the final semester of his/her Programme of Study and has no backlog in earlier semesters, the University may make arrangement to hold Special End of Semester Examination only for such courses within one month of beginning of the new semester. For Integrated Studies, this clause is applicable only if the student opts for Exit option or in the final year. The grade for this course in Special End of Semester Examination cannot be more than Letter Grade B.  Resolution: The Academic Council approved the same.

	A Committee was constituted by the competent authority (Office Order No. 2293 dated 18.10.2024) to review the monthly salary to be paid to the Assistant Professor appointed on contract/temporary basis.
