Finance Officer, Shivaji University, Vidyanagar, Kolhapur, Prof. Suhas Pednekar, Former Vice-Chancellor, University of Mumbai has been nominated as a member of the Finance Committee as per Section 24 of "the Central Universities Act, 2009" and Statue 17 (1)(iv).</p> <p>In place of Prof. S.K. Singh, Vice-Chancellor, Rajasthan Technical University, Kota, Shri S.K. Kejriwal, Chartered Accountant from Mumbai has been nominated as a member of the Finance Committee as per Section 24 of "the Central Universities Act, 2009" and Statue 17 (1)(iv).</p> <p>The contribution made by Shri B.S. Patil & Prof. S.K. Further, M/s NPCC has not been responding promptly or adequately to queries, communications, and reports from the Central University of Rajasthan (CURAJ). The explanations provided by M/s NPCC in response to repeated follow-ups have been found to be unsatisfactory and irrelevant to the issues raised.

The Building and Works Committee may review the current status of the above-mentioned projects, deliberate on the delays and lapses by M/s NPCC and consider suitable directions or corrective measures to ensure timely completion of works and improved responsiveness from the PMC.

Resolution: The Committee reviewed the present status and progress of the NPCC and resolved that a final warning letter be issued to the NPCC for improvement within the 15 days, failing which necessary action shall be taken as per the terms and conditions of the tender.

The matter was noted by the Finance Committee.

Considering the students, staff, their family members and other supporting staff which are increasing so there is need of 10 bedded PHC new building for providing better health care services because the health center is running OLD VC House and not proper structure like Hospital/Health center like Physiotherapy center is running 1st floor which is not good for physiotherapist patient, one medical officer room, not proper space of wards like male and female for IPD patients, isolation wards for spreading disease, Counsellor room for counselling.

Furthermore, it is proposed to undertake the horizontal expansion of the existing Yoga Building to meet the growing requirements of the Yoga Department, including the increased student intake, establishment of laboratories, a Kriya Hall, and other departmental activities.

In order to provide these facilities to all stakeholders, University obtained the preliminary estimate of Rs. 165.16 Crore from the UPRRNL for submission of the proposal to HEFA. The bifurcation is as under:

To consider facility of Corporate Card for Official purposes

This is regarding the requirement for facilitating various online and card-based payments related to University transactions. There have been multiple instances where payments through PFMS are not feasible due to maker, checker and approver utilities. This is mainly happens for payments needed directly on website of merchants (e.g., registration fee for different purposes for pharmacy, architecture, NAAC, online software subscriptions, instant payment of gold at Govt outlet and medals etc for convocation, training charges etc.), where immediate payment is required.

In such scenario, it is not possible to make payment through standard system of PFMS as well giving advance amounts are also not recommended from financial proprietary point. Hence, it is proposed to avail facility of a Commercial Card to ensure smooth payments and obtaining of such services and goods. In this regard, ICICI bank has been approached and the card proposed by the bank will offer the following benefits:

- Interest-free period of approximately 45 days
- No joining or annual fees, as to be waived by the bank
- Zero transaction charges
- Cashback offers, will be applicable as per the bank's scheme prevailing at the time.
- Monthly statements for transparency and reconciliation

Usage Protocol:

- The card will not be used on a credit basis. The card will be charged with an appropriate amount after obtaining approval from the Competent Authority and amount will be further transferred to the respective beneficiary.
- As a principle, no credit facility will be utilized.

For issuance of a corporate card, the bank requires a Fixed Deposit @ 120%, against which the maximum credit limit will be up to 85% of the FD value.

It is proposed that the card may be kept in the custody of either:

1. The Registrar, OR
2. The Finance Officer

The designated officer will be responsible for ensuring timely settlement of all payments made using the card.

In view of the above, approval is kindly sought for obtaining the facility of Corporate Card from ICICI Bank with a maximum credit limit of Rs. 20.00 Lakhs (Rupees Twenty

Lakhs only), and for creating a Fixed Deposit of Rs. 24.00 Lakhs with ICICI Bank.

IFD, MOE has stated that the item is not recommended. All payments should be made through PFMS only.

Resolution: It was clarified that University is making all the payments from grant through PFMS only. However, there are certain payments to be made directly through website/challan mode only viz. payment of registration fee, subscriptions etc., which can't be executed through PFMS. In such a situation, demand of advances is raised by the employees, which is discouraged by the University to bring in more financial discipline and avoid interest loss on exchequer.

After having assurance from university that this facility will be used only in the cases, where direct payment through PFMS is not possible and payment to this card will be made from PFMS, the Finance Committee recommended the proposal for approval of the Executive Council.

Custody of this card will be with the Finance Officer/ Registrar.

To adopt and consider implementation of Special Provisions for Scientific Ministries/Departments in General Financial Rules (GFRs), 2017

Ministry of Finance, Procurement Policy Division has issued amendments in GFR Rules vide Office Memorandum No.F.20/42/2021-PPD, dated June 05, 2025 and extract of which are deciphered as below:

- (i) Vice-Chancellors/ Directors of scientific organisations I academic institutions under Ministries/ Department/ Organisations indicated at para 2 above are permitted to make non-Government e-Marketplace (GeM) procurement of scientific equipment and consumables.
- (ii) The monetary ceilings under Rule 154, 155, 161 & 162 of GFRs, 2017 for procurement of scientific equipment and consumables by the Ministries/ Departments/ Organizations mentioned under para 2 above shall be as follows:

Resolution: The Finance Committee considered the same and recommended to Executive Council for adoption of the OM.

To consider GPAT fellowship to the GPAT qualified M. Pharm 12 students (Academic year 2024-25) of the Department of Pharmacy from IRG funds

To complete the application process for extension of approval for the academic year 2024-25, an affiliation fee of ₹1,77,012/- was paid to the Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) through e-challan dated 18.01.2024. The transaction was completed by the Finance & Accounts Section on 19.01.2024, however, PCI has not acknowledged the receipt of the fee.

Despite continued follow-up with PCI since March 2024, the issue remains unresolved. On verification, it was found that the fee was inadvertently transferred to an incorrect PCI bank account due to a mismatch in the account number mentioned in the challan and the one used for the transfer. Due to availability of two bank account details, in place of account No. BDSKZEF71687080528, the fee was transferred to the other account of PCI as BDSKXEF71015088083 and transaction was successful.

Subsequently, in January 2025 the PCI initiated disbursement of GPAT fellowships at ₹12,400/- per month per student from the date of admission. However, the name of Department of Pharmacy, Central University of Rajasthan, was not listed on the Canara Bank Scholarship Portal of PCI.

This has caused concern among the GPAT-qualified M. Pharm. students admitted in 2024-25, and several have submitted formal requests to the University.

Subsequently, consequent upon receipt of decision regarding approval of three M. Pharm courses for the Academic Year 2025-26 by the PCI, University has deposited the pending Pharmacy Education Regulatory Charges (PERC) of PCI-452 for the Academic year 2024-25 vide letter dated 30.06.2025. However, there is no confirmation as on date regarding approval for the Academic Year 2024-25 and release of GPAT fellowship of M. Pharm students for the academic year 2024-25.

In view of the above, considering larger interest of students and to avoid disruption in their academic support, it is proposed that the University may disburse the interim GPAT fellowship amount @ ₹8,000/- per month at par with non-net fellowship amount (against 12,000/- per month) at this stage to each eligible student from **Internal Revenue Generation (IRG) funds**.

The tentative financial implication is ₹9.60 lakhs per annum (for 12 students for 10 months).

Resolution: The Finance Committee considered the same and recommended the proposal to Executive Council for approval.
