Dr. Avantika Singh is Assistant Professor, Department of Management, Central University of Rajasthan, Kishangarh, Ajmer. She completed her PhD in Management from Institute of Rural Management Anand (Gujarat) in 2008. Her doctoral thesis was titled, 'Health Reforms in Rajasthan: A Study from Governance Perspective'. She was recipient of the prestigious Sir Ratan Tata Trust Fellowship. She did her MBA from Motilal Nehru National Institute of Technology, Allahabad, and BSc from MDSU, Ajmer. She has more than 19 years of experience, which includes 17.5 years in academics (teaching at PG level) and 2.5 years in research and industry.
