Upon completion of the recruitment process, the duly constituted Result Processing Committee submitted the result and score of the candidates in order of merit as per the criteria of the advertisement. Accordingly, Mr. Gaurav Agrawal, securing the highest score (63.09), was recommended to offer the post of Section Officer. Accordingly, with due approval of the Competent Authority, Offer of Appointment dated 08.01.2025 was issued to Mr. Gaurav Agrawal with a condition to join within six weeks (i.e., by 18.02.2025). Upon his request dated 18.02.2025, seeking an extension of two months, an extension was granted up to 02.03.2025. But Mr. Gaurav Agrawal did not join the post even by the extended deadline <i>i.e.</i> 02.03.2025, hence, the Offer of Appointment was cancelled with the approval of the Competent Authority. It is noteworthy that the result for the post of Section Officer (01-UR) was prepared by the duly constituted Committee through transparent process. The proposed site is conveniently located near the bank, health center, and Gate No. 3, reducing confusion and avoiding unnecessary entry into the university's main campus. 4. Adequate Land Availability: While the required area for the KV School is 3780 sqm, the proposed site offers a total area of 9400 sqm, thereby accommodating future expansion and infrastructure needs. <p>In view of the above, the proposed location for the KV School may be approved and for the construction of the school building at the new site. In many cases, these communications are directly addressed to senior officials without prior consultation, leading to unnecessary disruptions in workflow and diluting the importance of genuinely critical matters. 3. In order to streamline official communication, maintain decorum, and promote professionalism, it is proposed to formulate a set of mandatory guidelines governing the use of email for official purposes. The guidelines emphasize proper channelization of communication, relevance, documentation, formal tone, and email etiquette. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) All issues/ matters must be routed through the proper channel and concerned Dean/HOD/Section In-Charge before escalation. 2) Emails must be specific, concise, and backed by necessary documentation. 3) Only documented communications will be considered and verbal references to be avoided. 4) Communication must be restricted to relevant recipients only. 5) Descriptive and context-based subject lines are to be used. 6) Emails must maintain official decorum with proper salutations and language. 7) Reasonable time (4–5 working days) must be allowed before follow-ups. 8) Official designation, department, and contact details to be included in all official emails. 9) Non-compliance of the above guidelines may be treated as misconduct and may attract appropriate administrative action as per the Conduct Rules. 4. If the University deems it appropriate, it may issue guidelines through group emails. The right to send group emails shall rest with the Heads of Departments, Deans, and Officers-in-Charge. <p>Resolution: The Executive Council observed that such policy should have been there to streamline the official communication, maintain decorum and promote professionalism in the University. 56-5.6	<p>Appointment of Intercontinental Education Link Ltd. as Counsellor cum Consultant for admission of International Students</p> <p>In alignment with the internationalization objectives outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the Central University of Rajasthan has actively engaged in outreach initiatives to attract international students. During the last academic year, the University participated in education fairs held in Myanmar, Tanzania, Uganda, Rwanda, and Ghana. These efforts showcased the University's academic strengths and infrastructure to a global audience.</p> <p>In the course of these engagements, Intercontinental Education Link Ltd., a consultancy firm based in Tanzania and led by Dr. Kisimbira Muhammed, expressed interest in partnering with the University to support student recruitment from East African countries including Tanzania, Uganda, Kenya, Malawi, Zambia, Ethiopia, and Liberia. After several rounds of interaction, the firm has proposed the following terms:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A counselling fee of USD 300 per student admitted through the firm. 2. Marketing fees to be paid if a representative of the firm participates in education fairs on behalf of the University. <p>Appointing a regional consultancy firm is expected to be more effective and cost-efficient than solely participating in international education fairs. The firm’s targeted outreach at schools and institutions across multiple countries is likely to yield higher-quality applications and increased enrolment of meritorious international students.</p> <p>From a financial perspective, the consultancy fee is justified. For instance, the total tuition fee for high-demand programs like B.Tech. for AY 2025–26 is USD 9,080, which significantly exceeds the per-student consultancy fee. Even in other academic programs,</p>

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	<p>the tuition and hostel fees from international students consistently surpass the proposed charges, ensuring a positive financial return to the University. Accordingly, it is proposed that this arrangement shall apply only to those programmes where the total tuition fee per student exceeds the USD 300 counselling fee and Marketing fee.</p> <p>In view of the above, the following is proposed for consideration and approval:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Approval for the appointment of Intercontinental Education Link Ltd. as Counsellor for international student admissions limited to specific academic programmes considering tuition fee justification with respect to charges. 2. Authorization to issue a signed copy of the approved proposal to the firm from the Registrar's Office. <p>Resolution: The Executive Council appreciated the Vice Chancellor to take the initiative for increasing the University's outreach for attracting international students admission. Approved the above proposal for appointment of Intercontinental Education Link Ltd. as Counsellor for international student admissions limited to specific academic programmes considering tuition fee justification with respect to charges. The Executive Council also authorised the Vice Chancellor to take a decision with respect to specific programmes on its behalf.</p>
