CONNECTING WITH THE GLOBAL WORLD



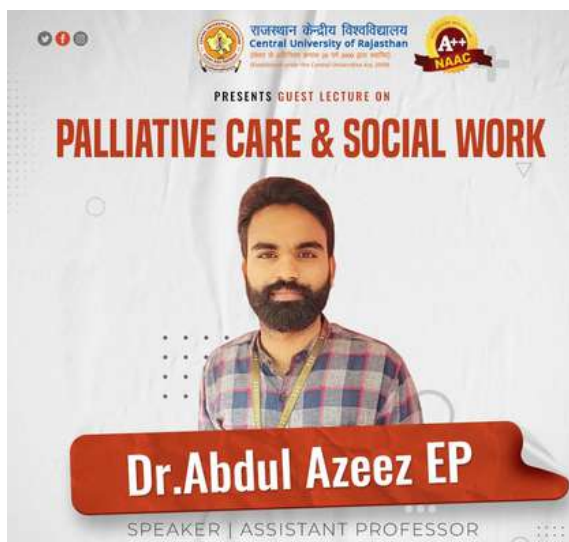

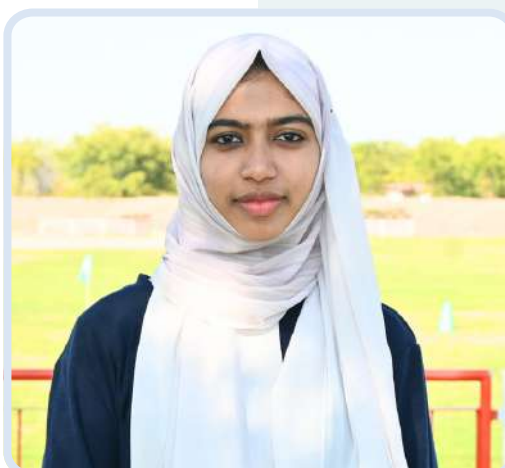
